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Minutes of a Rescheduled Regular Meeting of the Mount Joy Township Planning Commission Held on December 5, 2022

1. Michael McKinne called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. in the Elizabethtown Area School District Middle School Auditorium, 600 East High Street, Elizabethtown, PA 17022.

2. Pledge of Allegiance

3. Roll call of the Planning Commission Members:

4. Public Comment:

Ben Dunlap, resident at 110 Meadowbrook Lane, read a statement on behalf of multiple households on Meadowbrook Lane regarding the Bear Creek Estates residential development proposed to the east of their neighborhood. He was unhappy with the plan approval process, detailing multiple public meetings and Township staff review letters. The major issue relates to proposed connections or waivers of connections to Meadowbrook Lane and East College Avenue. Recommendations for redesigning the road network were offered.

- 5. Consent Calendar:
 - a. Approve and ratify the minutes of the October 24, 2022 meeting

A motion was made by Gerald Cole and seconded by Kevin Baker to approve the consent calendar. All members present voted in favor of the motion.

- 6. Old Business: NONE
- 7. New Business:
 - a. <u>Review of Proposed Ordinance to Amend the Township Zoning Ordinance (Pennmark)</u> Proposal to rezone approximately 55.4 acres generally located at the northeast corner of Cloverleaf Road and West Main Street (Route 230) to the C-2 General Commercial District. The subject properties are currently zoned a mix of C-1 Limited Commercial District and A Agricultural District. Text amendments to the Zoning Ordinance are also proposed.

Representatives of Pennmark Management Company included Attorney Craig Edwards, Bob Sichelstiel, and Justin Bartholomew. Traffic engineer Greg Creasy of Grove Miller Engineering was present as was Todd Smeigh of DC Gohn Associates.

Mr. Edwards presented an overview of the proposed shopping center development on the subject site, which requires C-2 zoning to move forward with. Through a series of exhibits he demonstrated the history of Pennmark's acquisition of properties comprising the subject site, traffic improvements such as the extension of Norlanco Drive, and local planning documents accounting for commercial development in that location. Pennmark is working with Tyson Foods to purchase part of the hatchery property and connect it to the site. The Tyson subdivision is the subject of a open variance application before the Zoning Hearing Board. He noted that the site will no longer be farmed regardless of this meeting's outcome.

Multiple leases are in place for various spaces within the proposed development. Rezoning the entire site, not just a portion of the site, is necessary to support the financial viability of the project. Costs attributed to earthwork, infrastructure, and offsite traffic improvements require the ability to develop the full shopping center. Mr. Sichelstiel discussed the Township's Act 209 plan, specifically the \$3 million in fees that will be paid to the Township for offsite improvements. Without those fees the plan cannot be implemented. Property and payroll taxes will also be increased by the shopping center. Mr. Bartholomew provided details on the co-location requirements between the various leases, another reason substantiating their request to rezone the entire site.

The Commission questioned the viability of large-scale retail development in this community, especially after the pandemic and how it further shifted public tendencies for purchasing goods. Redevelopment and infill opportunities are found throughout the Route 230 corridor. Concerns with bringing on hundreds of thousands of square feet of new commercial space conflicts with redevelopment.

Mr. Creasy spoke about how the Act 209 studies are developed and what Pennmark would do to implement it. Additional through lanes along Route 230 at the Cloverleaf Road intersection are proposed by the plan in addition to intersection improvements along the Cloverleaf Road corridor. A traffic study was submitted to PennDOT and the Township for review. Their firm is working on addressing review comments and refining access points to the site.

Members of the public then addressed the applicant and Planning Commission with the following general comments:

- Deb Berger, Homestead Rd. traffic impacts, no need for large commercial development

A motion was made by Gerald Cole and seconded by Kevin Baker to recommend that the Board of Supervisors not adopt the proposed ordinance. All members present voted in favor of the motion.

b. <u>Review of Proposed Ordinance to Amend the Township Zoning Ordinance (Panattoni)</u> – Proposal to rezone approximately 281 acres generally located east of Cloverleaf Road and on both sides of Route 283 to the

GI – General Industrial District. The subject properties are currently zoned a mix of LI – Light Industrial District and A – Agricultural District. Text amendments to the Zoning Ordinance are also proposed.

The applicant was represented by Attorney Esch McCombie of McNees Wallace and Nurick, Joe Peters of Panattoni Development Co., Jeremy Bittinger of Landworks, and Jarred Peters of Traffic Planning and Design.

Mr. McCombie gave an overview of the areas subject to the rezoning request as well as the associated proposal to construct four warehouses on three parcels. Traffic improvements at the Cloverleaf Road/Route 283 interchange and the Cloverleaf Road/Schwanger Road intersection generally consist of roundabouts to regulate traffic flow. Reconstruction of the interchange is not realistic due to cost and scope, so alternative improvements like roundabouts are a reasonable way to approach the problem and build capacity. The ordinance amendment proposes the General Industrial District for the development tracts since the Township currently provides a minimal amount of land zoned that way for the landfill. Warehouse uses were stated to generate less traffic than residential or retail development on a comparable area of land.

Mr. Peters provided background on his international development firm and the presence they wish to make in the Township. Mr. Bittinger spoke to the concept plan that the proposed amendments would enable. In addition to designing the sites for construction of the warehouses, his firm considered mitigation of offsite impacts such as light pollution, traffic circulation at and to/from each location, and stormwater management. Mr. Neal recapped congestion planning and mitigation efforts for the Cloverleaf Road corridor over the past two decades. He noted that traffic related to warehouses is typically spread throughout the day and not concentrated in peak hours. Panattoni's plan also includes relocating the informal park and ride located at the eastbound offramp to the northwest corner of the interchange. The Mount Pleasant Road warehouses drive the need to construct a connector road to Steel Way as well as improvements to the Steel Way/Cloverleaf Road intersection.

Mr. McKinne was concerned that the community is not equipped to handle this scale of warehouse development. Other areas like the Lehigh Valley have tailored their land use ordinances to deal with this more modern form of warehousing. Impacts like air pollution, traffic, viewsheds, and rural character are all key issues. Mr. Cole asked how large the buildings are proposed to be. Two will be in the vicinity of 1,000,000 sf. and two will be aroudn 325,000-350,000 sf. Height will be less than 50'. They are speculative buildings at this time.

Mr. Peters spoke to plans for water and sewer extensions. The utility lines will not pass residential structures, so mandatory connection should not be an issue. Fire protection will be provided in some fashion depending on utility availability and capability. 24/7 operation is possible since they will market the warehouse spaces to a variety of users.

Mr. Boll questioned whether close to 3,000,000 sf. under roof is necessary given all of the warehouse construction taking place in the area, including just north of Mount Joy Township along Route 230. Mr. Peters believed all that new adjacent capacity is leased or being negotiated. Mr. Boll then asked if this is an all-or-nothing proposal, to which Mr. Peters responded that he would need to revisit the numbers to properly answer the question. The cost of utilities and transportation improvements require a minimum scale of development to support the upfront investments.

Members of the public addressed the applicant and Planning Commission with the following general comments:

Mr. McKinne noted concerns with the proposed ordinance that would make large warehouses by-right uses instead of having an additional step in the approval process like a special exception. 24/7 operation is also an issue for surrounding residents. He would like to see more sustainability measures in the amendment for buildings that large.

A motion was made by Delmar Oberholtzer and seconded by Arlen Mummau to recommend that the Board of Supervisors not adopt the proposed ordinance. All members present voted in favor of the motion.

 - a. <u>Mount Joy Borough Authority Fairview Street Water Main Replacement</u> Proposal to replace a failing public water main and install an additional fire hydrant to improve water quality and water volume. MJBA is seeking funding through the PA Department of Community and Economic Development.
 - b. <u>Elizabethtown Borough/Elizabethtown Regional Sewer Authority</u> Proposal to rehabilitate an aging public sewer main (Radio Road Interceptor). Elizabethtown Borough and ERSA are seeking funding through the PA Department of Community and Economic Development.

Mr. Evans gave a brief overview of the applications to be submitted by the two authorities. The proposed system improvements will benefit service areas within Mount Joy Township. A motion was made by Delmar Oberholtzer and seconded by Rodney Boll to issue consistency letters/letters of support for each application. All members present voted in favor of the motion.

- Karen L. Boyer, Chairperson, called the meeting to order at 7:03 P.M. in the Mount Joy Township Fairview Municipal Building at 8853 Elizabethtown Road, Elizabethtown, PA 17022.
- Roll call: Present Karen L. Boyer, William Duncan, John L. Felix, Jr. and Adam Reed. Absent - Andrew Treese.

Others in attendance – Patricia J. Bailey, Township Secretary, and Justin S. Evans, Township Manager/Zoning Officer.

- 3. Public Comment: None.
- 4. <u>Approval and ratification of the minutes of the September 13, 2022 meeting</u>. (The October and November meetings were cancelled):

A motion was made by John L. Felix, Jr. and seconded by Adam Reed to approve the minutes for the June 14, 2022 meeting with the following change: Item 5 Old trolley Line Park – Future Phases, 2nd bullet point should read – Rheems Elementary School Sale – could lose fields which includes a multipurpose field and softball field. All members present voted in favor of the motion.

- 5. 1376 Campus Road Park & Rec Fee-in-Lieu:
 - a. Andrew Miller, Director of Land Development with Catalyst, was in attendance to discuss the Park & Recreation Fee-In-Lieu of money required for the property located at 1376 Campus Road. The proposed development includes 2 pools, clubhouses, bocce ball, tot lot, and walking trails. There will also be sidewalks throughout the development. The walking trails will be available to the public with the other amenities being for the residents of the development. The facilities will be maintained by the homeowner's association. Mr. Miller explained Catalyst is requesting a reduction of \$709,500.00 since the development will be constructing the amenities listed above. The amenities would be installed in phases as the development progresses. There was a lengthy discussion on what benefit the proposed amenities will have on the Township since they will be maintained by the HOA. Mr. Felix stated he could see providing a reduction in fee for the cost of the walking trails as the public could use them. Mr. Evans stated the Planning Commission approved the waiver but wanted the Board of Supervisors to decide on the value. The Park and Recreation Board should provide a recommendation.
 - b. A motion was made by Adam Reed and seconded by John L. Felix, Jr. to make a recommendation to the Mount Joy Township Board of Supervisors to allow for a deduction in the payment of Feein-Lieu money in the amount of \$157,500 for the construction of walking trails for the future development of the property located at 1376 Campus Road. (Total Fee-in-Lieu due with deduction would be \$669,742.68.) All members present voted in favor of the motion.

Mr. Felix feels with this motion it provides a guide for handling future amenities that support the entire Township and a possible reduction in the amount of Fee-in-Lieu money that is due to the Township.

6. MJT Park, Recreation and Open Space Plan:

Begin the process of updating the MJT Park, Recreation and Open Space Plan.

Information included:

- a. Official Map Recreational Facilities, Sheet 3 March 2010. Mr. Evans stated an update of the recreational facilities will take place during the planning process. The goal is to connect trails to parks and commercial businesses. Trails are difficult in the agricultural district as there are no sidewalks to connect with. Ms. Boyer asked if a portion of the Raffensperger property could be shown as a potential park. Mr. Evans said if it is shown on the official map, it gives an advantage to having the dedication of the property.
- b. E-mail from Mike Domin, Park Land Guidelines.
- c. Park and Open Space Components (NRPA).
- d. Census Reporter.

Mr. Evans will pull some more detailed reports; economic reports; projection for growth; numbers of acres needed for parkland acquisition; number of units within the next 10 years. The board feels a survey should be done of Township residents to see what is needed to grow our parks.

Reading through the first 10 pages several adjustments were noted to be made. Ms. Bailey will update and provide copies to the board at a future meeting.



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


