### Thanks to Our Parks & Recreation Board

A special "thank you" goes out to the citizens on the Township Parks & Recreation Board for spearheading two big initiatives last year. The 2015 *Park, Recreation, and Open Space Plan* was updated with actionable ideas to provide these amenities to the community – including this year's focus

on how to expand Old Trolley Line Park. Speaking of which, Don Bush and the Board deserve many thanks for leading the tree planting at OTLP to provide much - needed shade around the picnic and playground area.



During this time of year, we often receive inquiries regarding the burning ordinance, particularly about burning pits. The township allows burning pits as long as they comply with safety guidelines. Here are some important points to keep in mind when using a burning pit:

- The diameter of the pit cannot exceed 3 feet.

- The pit must have a wire mesh screen with openings of no more than two inches over the flame to prevent embers from escaping into the air.

- It is prohibited to burn household trash, recyclables, leaves, or yard waste.

- The pit should be placed at least 15 feet away from any building, structure, or other flammable material.

- A responsible adult must supervise the burning at all times.

- The pit fire should be immediately extinguished after use and not left to burn out.

- Do not use a pit fire, or any fire, during dry drought conditions or high winds.

### Water Quality Tips For Residents

<u>Fertilizer may not be the solution</u>. If your lawn is not looking as healthy and green as you would like, sometimes fertilizer is not the answer. Maintaining an appropriate soil pH is essential to promoting proper nutrient availability. Soil texture and organic matter content influence water movement, nutrient availability, and the microbial ecosystem of the soil. A healthy soil supports a healthy lawn.

<u>Raise your mower deck</u>. Set your mower deck to 3 inches or higher. Alternatively, you can use low mow turf species, such as fine fescue blends, that do best when mowing is limited. A taller, healthier lawn slows water movement and increases infiltration keeping moisture, soil, and nutrients where they are needed most.

<u>Provide a buffer</u>. Do not mow up to the banks of streams. Maintaining vegetative buffers along waterways provides wildlife habitat while slowing and filtering water before it enters the stream.
