FALL IS HERE AND SO ARE A FEW CHANGES

After holding prices steady over the past several years for service tags, yard waste bags, recycle bins and pavilion rentals, the Board of Supervisors at their September board meeting approved the following rate increases. These increases will allow us to maintain the 2025 trash billing rate into 2026.

As of November 1st, 2025 — The Following Price Increases Will Take Place

Extra Bag Tag — \$2.00

White Goods Tag — \$15.00

Tire Tag — \$5.00

Recycle Bins — \$5.00

Woody Yard Waste Bags — \$.50 Per Bag (25 bags = \$12.50, 50 bags = \$25.00)

In addition, as of January 1, 2026 — The Pavilion Rental Fees Will Be Increased

Resident - \$30.00

Non-Resident — \$50.00

- Sealcoat standard application on Range Road & Old Market Street.




rental licenses – Invoices for the 2026 rental licenses are being sent to property owners in October 2025. Rental license applications are due to the Township by December 31, 2025. The application may be completed online at www.mtjoytwp.org or sent by U.S. mail to 8853 Elizabethtown Rd., Elizabethtown, PA 17022. Applications may also be dropped off at our office between 8:00 am to 4:00 pm Monday thru Friday or placed in the exterior secure drop box in front of the office 24 hours a day. Fall and Winter Reminders:

* Do not place leaves on Township roads, in drainage ditches or over storm drains. If you have a storm drain in front of your property, please keep it clear of leaves and all debris.

- * Basketball nets that hang over <u>any</u> portion of a Township road must be removed. They are hazards to any passing vehicles, including garbage trucks, delivery trucks and, especially, snow plows that need to get close to the curbing.
- * When snow falls, please be patient. We do our best to get a plow truck to your street as quickly as possible. Plowing main arteries will be our first priority, followed by secondary roads and then developments.
- * Do not throw snow into the street. When the plow truck comes by, the snow will inevitably end up back on your property. It is NOT the responsibility of the Township to clear the end of your driveway once the plow has passed through.
- When a snowstorm is forecast, please remove all vehicles from Township roads so the entire road can be plowed.
- * Sidewalks and fire hydrants must be cleared within 24 hours after the end of a snow or ice event.

In the interest of helping to keep our community members safe, a "Safe Exchange Zone" is located in the parking lot of the Mount Joy Township Fairview Building Municipal Complex, 8855 Elizabethtown Road. Easily accessible in the front of the municipal complex parking lot, and in plain view of Elizabethtown Road, are two parking spaces visibly marked and reserved for anyone that wishes to meet and complete exchanges. This area is available for anything from financial transactions to safe child custody exchanges. The reserved open area spaces are well lit, easily

visible from the public roadway, as well as the municipal building, and are monitored by video recording 24/7 with an HD camera system capable of identifying persons and their registration plates if needed.

PENNSYLVANIA'S SCHOOL BUS STOPPING LAW

Keeping Children Safe

PENNSYLVANIA'S SCHOOL BUS STOPPING LAW

- When you meet or overtake a stopped school bus with red signal lights flashing and stop arm extended, you MUST STOP
- When you approach an intersection where a school bus is stopped with red signal lights flashing and stop arm extended, you MUST STOP.
- ◆ You MUST STOP at least ten (10) feet away from the school bus.
- ♦ You MUST WAIT until the red lights have stopped flashing and the stop arm has been withdrawn before
- ◆ DO NOT MOVE until all the children have reached a place of safety.

KNOW YOUR RESPONSIBILITIES

- ♦ 1.5 million children are transported on Pennsylvania roads each day
- These children are transported approximately 400 million miles to school each year.
- Every year, children are needlessly injured or killed by drivers passing stopped school buses.

Ambulance Billing: How Does It Work?

What happens when you call 911 and you are treated and/or transported by an ambulance crew? This is a question that is received often by the Municipal Emergency Services Authority of Lancaster County (MESA).



After MESA responds to a 911 call and evaluates, treats and/or transports a patient, there are three key factors that determine if or what the patient is charged for ambulance services including:

- Whether or not the patient has health insurance
- Whether or not MESA has the patient's insurance information
- Whether or not MESA's annual fee has been paid

Here's a detailed breakdown of the ambulance billing process:

- If you are evaluated, treated or transported and do not have insurance, but have paid your annual MESA fee, you will be billed 50% of the charge. If your annual MESA fee is not paid, you will be billed the full amount of the charge.
- If you are evaluated, treated or transported and do have insurance, MESA will bill your insurance if MESA has your insurance information. If MESA does not have your insurance information, you may receive a statement requesting your insurance information. Once your insurance information is obtained, MESA will then bill your insurance.
- If you have insurance and have paid your annual MESA fee:
 - If your insurance pays MESA, you will receive no residual bill.
 - If your insurance pays you, you must submit payment for that amount to MESA.
 - ♦ If your insurance allowance is applied to your deductible, MESA will bill you 50% of the charge.
- If you have insurance and have not paid your annual MESA fee:
 - ♦ If your insurance pays MESA, MESA will bill you the remaining balance.
 - ♦ If your insurance pays you, you must submit payment for the full amount to MESA.
 - ♦ If your insurance pays nothing, MESA will bill you the full amount.

Even with this explanation, we recognize that this process is not necessarily easy to follow! That is why you can also find a visual chart that details this process on MESA's website at mesalancasterpa.gov/ems-services/.
